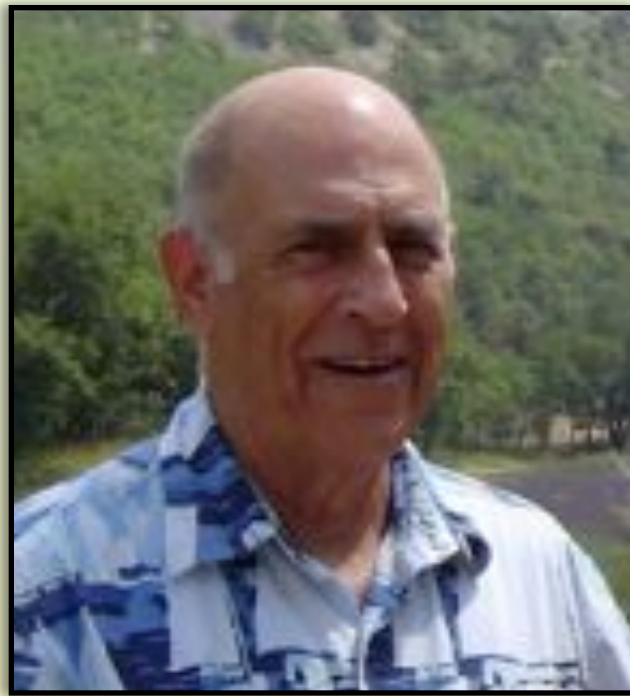
Just a few questions...

Upcoming changes or special events in your life?

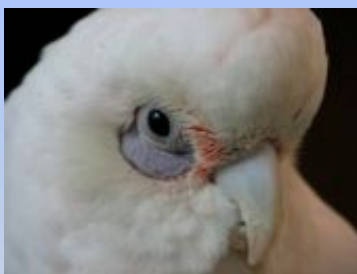
Looking forward to our 50th wedding anniversary. A couple years away tho!

Basic Mac 101

Just a mouse click away!

Feel sometimes you are all alone fiddling with your computer, things are not working right, you're lost, and don't have a clue what to do, short of just walking away? Bet you didn't realize help is at your fingertips, literally a mouse click away.

For starters, on the Apple menu at the top of your screen, 'bout midway across is the word: "**Help**" Right there you will find a literal storehouse of hints, help aids, ideas, or any and every Mac application, hardware question, or virtually any aspect of being a Mac user. In the search box, just type in your problem, and choices appear ranked in order of the "best" answers to your question.

The **Apple menu "Help"** is also found with every application you open, offering all sorts of answers to your questions or problems. Some of the "Help" menus even offer tutorials for the particular app - a teacher right on your desktop!

For more vexing problems, don't hesitate to post your problem/question or comment on the **TMUG forums**, <http://www.transylvaniamug.org/phpBB3/> a literal host of Mac experts from TMUG usually can help within 24 hours or less with all sorts of instructions and ideas. Best of all, it's FREE.

Of course there is the Apple support (<http://www.apple.com/support/>) and discussions boards on <http://discussions.apple.com/index.jspa>, you have a bevy of worldwide Mac users and enthusiasts for you to research, participate or just keep informed.

Of course you already know about Basic Mac 101-you are coming right? For those who know someone just starting, or converting from windows to Mac, or you just want more Basic Mac 101 more frequently, each Wednesday at 1:30-3 pm, beginning Oct.1 through Nov. 19 I'll be teaching an 8 week course at Brevard College Creekside.
